### **TARGET STRUCTURES**

1. viene a un pueblo - s/he comes to a town
2. toda la gente lee - all of the people read
3. pone (libros) encima de - s/he puts (books) on top of

1. Los niños leen libros de aventura porque son interesantes.

### **PERSONALIZED QUESTIONS FOR CLASS DISCUSSION**

*\*Since the story script does not contain many repetitions of “encima de”, try to really target that phrase with your PQA.*

1. ¿Qué personas famosas vienen a nuestro pueblo?
2. ¿Pones salsa de tomate encima de qué?
3. ¿Qué pones encima de tu (helado, panqueques, sándwiches, pizza, etc.)?
4. ¿Más gente lee periódicos o (mira las noticias en la televisión, lee las noticias en el Internet, escucha la radio, etc.)?
5. ¿(Por qué/cuándo) (no) viene mucha gente a nuestro pueblo?
6. ¿Qué leen todos los estudiantes/profesores de nuestra escuela?
7. ¿Toda la gente de nuestro pueblo puede leer?
8. Form teams of 3-4 students and give instructions for them to create a tower by balancing common objects on top of each other. “Pongan un libro encima de la mesa. Pongan un diccionario encima del libro. Pongan una calculadora encima del libro...etc.” The last group with a standing tower wins!

### **SCRIPT**

Hoy, nosotros vamos a hablar de **un pueblo** especial. Es **un pueblo** especial porque **toda la gente del pueblo** son mujeres. No hay hombres en **el pueblo**; solo mujeres. Solo hay mujeres porque es ilegal mirar fútbol americano en la televisión allí. **El pueblo**

se llama LadyVille. Como no hay hombres, las mujeres de LadyVille están desesperadas.

Ningún hombre vive en LadyVille, pero a veces un hombre **viene** a LadyVille para conocer a una esposa. Cuando un hombre **viene al pueblo**, un reportero siempre habla con el hombre y **pone** su biografía en **el periódico** de Ladyville. **Toda la gente** de Ladyville **lee** la biografía.

Hay una mujer en particular que está totalmente desesperada. Ella se llama Jessica. Jessica tiene 63 años pero no tiene esposo. Ella quiere hijos pero sabe que está muy vieja para tener hijos. Ella **lee el periódico** todos los días, buscando a un esposo.

## ENGLISH

There is one woman in particular that is totally desperate. Her name is Jessica. Jessica is 63 years old, but she doesn't have a husband. She wants children, but she knows that she is very old to have kids. She reads the newspaper every day, looking for a husband.

*\*\*For each of the men in the story, choose one of the articles that your students created (or that my students created) on which to base the male character. Use details from the articles to personalize this part of the story.*

One day, a man named Rodrigo comes to the town. He talks with the reporter and the reporter puts Rodrigo's biography in the newspaper. All of the people of LadyVille read the biography. (Show the news article to the class and read it together.) The biography says that Rodrigo has a lot of money. Also, it says that Rodrigo is tall and handsome. But Rodrigo doesn't like cats. Many people think that Rodrigo is the ideal man, but Jessica has 102 cats, and therefore Rodrigo is not perfect for her. She puts the newspaper on top of the other newspapers in the trash and cries.
