Lesson Plans:

Please write this on the board before students arrive at class:

LA CAMPANADA

1. Translate this story into English.
2. Draw a picture to illustrate this story.

Señora Bex es muy grande porque hay un bebé en su estómago. ¡El bebé está en su estómago porque ella comió el bebé! Señora Bex es un monstruo.

1. La Campanada: Students will translate the story that you wrote on the board and then draw a picture to illustrate it. Give them 5-7 minutes to complete it. Take attendance while they are working, then collect it when you are ready and most students have finished.
2. Please give students the page of stories that corresponds to their class period. You should have 35 copies for each class, which gives you some extras. Students will follow the instructions on the worksheet. They should work INDIVIDUALLY and SILENTLY. They may use the dictionaries that are on the shelves behind the sliding white boards at the side of the room.
3. If students finish early, have them choose a second story from the worksheet and add the same three words into that story as well (the same as they did for the first story). If they finish that, have them repeat it again for a third story.
4. If they finish all of those things, have them choose a children's book from the shelves that are directly in front of my desk and write down 10 words that they recognize from the book and 10 new words and what they think that they mean.
5. Have students write their names on all papers and hand them into the tray on my desk before they leave.
